## Curriculum

I did most of my studies in Italy including my PhD. I then made a career in France where I have been living since the middle of the 1980s. I was first a language assistant, then assistant professor and full professor at the Université de Savoie, and ultimately at the Université Sorbonne Nouvelle Paris 3. I've been teaching nineteenth century French literature at every university level. I was able to teach in the United States, as a guest professor at the University of Indiana in Bloomington in 2014. I was head of the *Centre de Recherche sur les Poétiques du XIXe siècle* (EA3423), of which I am still a member. I have organized around twelve conferences and collective publications and have been at the head of publishing teams (Gautier's critique, Taine's essays). I am a member of a number of peer-review committees. I am a member of the Sigismondo Malatesta society scientific committee. I am currently editorial co-director of two scientific series at the Classiques Garnier editions.

My research activity has always been focused on novels or short stories corpuses, given that my main interest is the nature of the modern narrative. My study emphasizes on thematic, literary image and metaphorology, progressively coming across research subjects which required non-literary concepts from science or philosophy. If I was mainly interested in French literature, my initial comparative approach (relation between France and Italy) widened towards a global vision of the European nineteenth century, which I address when attempting to shed a new light on traditional notions of literary history such as romanticism. Besides, the essential nature of some of the topics I have addressed, such as that of the literary representation, had lead me to seek in the past, and more precisely in Antiquity, the core issues of which I was examining the modern posterity.
